Week Five: Mary Magdalene	Discussion questions
VIDEO VIEWER GUIDE In Matthew 6:12, Jesus instructs us to pray, " our debts." At the tomb of Christ, like Mary Magdalene, we find new life. And because we've been forgiven so much, we love much.	Icebreaker (loosen things up with a lighthearted question): When you were little did you ever give your sibling or friend the silent treatment? Why and what happened?
1st truth: We must in asking God's mercy. Last at the cross, and first at the grave (Matthew 27:56, 61)—even when Jesus's other disciples fell away, Mary Magdalene shows us an example of the dogged determination in the life of one who's been forgiven.	When you received Christ's forgiveness, what was the experience like for you? (This can be your salvation, or another more recent experience).
2nd truth: God He responds to our diligence in seeking Him Mary Magdalene was the privileged first to find her own Atonement between two angels in the mercy seat himself, Jesus Christ (Hebrews 9), when she came to the empty grave.	Have you struggled to forgive someone? Share your experience—what does it feel like when you can't seem to forgive? What does it do to your prayer life?
3rd truth: Because of God's forgiveness we can with mercy and grace!	Can you relate to the concept of being forgiven much and loving much (Luke 7:47)? Why or why not?
When we encounter the life-changing forgiveness that God offers, it spills over from our lives into the lives of others.	What stuck out to you during this week of study (this could come from the book or the video)?
